Haven't heard a lot from Peabo Bryson since his Missing You album back in 2007, so it's a pleasant surprise to find the 67-year-old back in harness with producers Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis for a new set on their reactivated Perspective Records label. Stand For Love certainly opens well enough, the recently circulated single All She Wants To Do Is Me providing a sonic bridge between what Jam/ Lewis did for such as Alex O'Neal and Cherrelle back in the day, and Peabo's own lateseventies/early-eighties sound, as it strides merrily and melodically along. The ballad that follows it, Love Like Yours, is decent too, although I wish they'd left the silly effects off the lead vocal: Peabo might [understandably] only be 95% of what he once was vocally these days, but he just doesn't need the help. The song itself is fine, though: one of those Bryson soul tunes rather than the M.O.R. slowies he sometimes deals in [to Grammy-winning effect]. The Spanish guitar intro and easy, finger-snapping sway to Looking For Sade is very cool; they then take him a bit more R&B/ pop on the shuffling title track [not my thing] and thereafter it all veers inexorably towards the cats' eyes - Goosebumps has a crossover country ballad feel to it, Exotic could be one of his Disney soundtrack tunes, Here For You is anthemic pop and Smile is aimed at the wedding market. A bit unimaginatively, they then close out with a medley of his old hits - Feel The Fire/I'm So Into You/Tonight I Celebrate My Love For You - leaving us with only eight new tracks and less 'soul-style' Peabo than we might have been hoping for.

On the other hand, half an album is more than


I was expecting from the man this year, so I won't say I'm unhappy.

By the way, Peabo became a father again on New Year's Day 2018, his British wife, Tanya Iformerly of the group 411 and 33 years his junior], producing them a son, name of Robert. Still feeling the fire, then.

Conversations, the new album from Bay Area bassist/bandleader Darryl Anders and his AgapeSoul outfit, is damn good. Alongside Anders, drummer Aaron Green, guitar player Cam Perridge and vocalist Zoe Ellis provide the core of the band, augmented from time to time by an impressive array of guest players, on this occasion including Tommy Sims, our own Geoffrey Williams, Paul Jackson Jr., Levi Seacer from Prince's set-up, Ivan Neville, Eric Gales and Snarky's two horn players Michael Maher and Chris Bullock. Musically, it sits on the fertile borderlands between soul, funk and jazz, so there are crossovers in style with such as EW&F and Incognito, and the songs are, if anything, up a notch or two from the previous set. The opening tune, Kite, has to be one of the year's most instantly addictive, bass-pulsec grooves. The Way That We Love, led by Zoe Ellis, could be an Incognito favourite from any of their last dozen albums. [Nice bass solo from Darryl.] Changes and its later reprise benefit from a relaxed, malleable vocal from the aforesaid Ms. Ellis. Elsewhere, Graham Central Station's Ashling Cole turns up to front a cover of The Ohios' Sweet Sticky Thing, Tommy Sims lends his voice to the ballad Home and Geoffrey Williams, once of this parish but now down in Australia, leads us through another slowie, Lesson. The funky, New Orleans-ish instrumental, Fruitvale Gumbo, is strong, too. cracker. And it's not even Christmas.
